You may well be aware that Munster's rugby match is off. And Liverpool's game against Leeds United on Sunday 26 is also off. All such measures are regrettable, but are the only way to keep you and all your family and friends safe and healthy.

We thank you for the constant and much appreciated support you give us all year, and we are thankful for the kind words many of you have shared, on the phone or by email.

We will keep you informed of course of good news when that is possible, but for the moment we can only speak to webcam as we wish you a Blessed and peaceful Christmas time.
